## About the David S. Leone Scholarship

Proceeds from this race will benefit the David S. Leone Memorial Scholarship Fund as well as the Police Athletic League of Buffalo. The Scholarship Fund has been established through Erie Community College (ECC) Foundation. The scholarship is awarded to a high school graduate enrolled in Erie Community College's (ECC) Criminal Justice/Law Enforcement Program, or a current ECC student enrolled.

David Leone was diagnosed Chronic Inflammatory Debilitating Polyneuropathy (CIDP) in 1980's. Chronic inflammatory demyelinating polyneuropathy (CIDP) is a neurological disorder characterized by progressive weakness and impaired sensory function in the legs and arms. The disorder is caused by damage to the fatty tissues covering that wraps around and protects nerve fibers of the peripheral nerves. It often presents with symptoms that include tingling or numbness in the toes and fingers, weakness of the arms and legs, loss of deep tendon reflexes, fatigue, and abnormal sensations. CIDP is closely related to Guillain-Barre syndrome and it is considered the chronic counterpart of that acute disease.

After thirteen (13) years as a Buffalo Municipal Housing Authority Police Officer David was forced to retire in 2001. In 2003 David decided to move with his family to the state of Florida. David was married and has a fourteen (14) year old daughter. Due to other medical complications his condition got worse and on October 5, 2009 he passed away. Our family decided to establish a scholarship in his memory at Erie Community College (ECC).
